REV. Dr. Richard Haley Sermon / Prayer

The Rev. Dr. Richard Haley is a native of Salem, Mass. After military service in the early to mid-1970's with an Army intelligence organization, Rev. Haley graduated from Gordon College in Wenham, Mass. with a BA in German Language & Literature and then pursued graduate theological education at Andover Newton Theological School in Newton, Mass. where he received a Master of Divinity degree and later a Doctor of Ministry degree. Ordained in 1982 as an American Baptist minister he served six years as pastor of the Union Church of Stow, Mass. He then became senior pastor of the First Baptist Church in Tewksbury where he served for eight years, leaving that church to accept a call to Andover Newton where he served as Vice President for Student Services, Dean of Students and instructor of preaching for almost nine years.

In 2004 he returned to pastoral ministry and spent 15 years as senior pastor of First-Calvary Baptist church in North Andover, retiring from full-time ministry in May of 2019. In September of 2019 Rev. Haley began service as an interim pastor at the West Acton Baptist Church in Massachusetts and after having completed that, he now serves as interim pastor at the First Baptist Church in Chelmsford, Massachusetts.

Rev. Haley resides in Lowell, Massachusetts with his wife, Judy. They have three grown children – Kevin and his wife Allison who live in Colorado, Cara who lives in Somerville and David in Nashua, New Hampshire.

ROB DRAKE SCRIPTURE

Rob Drake first visited Ocean Park with his wife Nancy in 1968, the year before their marriage. They, their three children and five grandchildren have been coming ever since. Rob was educated at the College of Wooster and the University of Michigan Law School, and prior to his retirement, practiced law in Newark, Ohio for 45 years.

The Drakes still live in Granville, Ohio, where Rob is a 60+ year member of the First Presbyterian Church, where he has served as a ruling elder. They summer in the Lindberg family cottage at the end of Free Street. Rob currently serves as President of the Ocean Park Association.

REV. STEVE YOUD PRAYER

The Rev. Steve Youd has served congregations in both the American Baptist Churches and the United Church of Christ. Most recently, he was the Senior Pastor for the Mashpee Congregational Church on Cape Cod. In addition, he has held 2 positions on the state denominational staff of the American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts, most recently as State Director of Mission & Stewardship, and earlier, as State Director of Youth & Young Adult Ministries. He is a graduate of Yale Divinity School where he was presented with the prestigious "Mersick Preaching Award", bestowed by the late A. Bartlett Giamatti, former President of Yale, and subsequently, Commissioner of Major League Baseball. He and his wife, Debbie, (and 3 grown daughters) hold Ocean Park as their "happy place!"

<u>The Williams Sound System</u>: This system aids the hearing impaired and is available from the ushers. It can be used in the Temple, while seated on the benches outside, or in a car.

<u>Mission Statement</u>: The purpose of the Ocean Park Association is to affirm the traditions and spiritual heritage of which we are heirs, through a summer assembly program where Christian worship, principles and ideals are at the focus; where diversity is celebrated and the dignity of all is embraced and respected; where the natural beauty of our seaside resort is conserved and enhanced; and where programs centered on religion, education, recreation and culture provide opportunities for individual growth and family enrichment.

<u>Temple History</u>: The Temple was built by Free Will Baptists during a six-week period in the summer of 1881; it was dedicated on August 2<sup>nd</sup> of that year, which was also the first day of the Assembly Program in Ocean Park. The octagonal structure represents an architectural style popular at the time. It seats up to 750 people, and is the site of most cultural events.

The Temple is open weekday mornings for meditation and observation.
