REV. Dr. Patricia Lyons Sermon

Dr. Lyons currently teaches evangelism, works with the Lifelong Learning team, and serves as the Senior Advisor to the Dean for Evangelism Initiatives at VTS. She also directs the EvangelismFormationLab@VTS, a digital portal on YouTube and Facebook offering original content from the Seminary as well as thoughtful curation of resources in evangelism and formation for the wider church. Dr. Lyons was a lay chaplain and teacher of religion in Episcopal schools for 20 years before being ordained a priest and then serving parishes in Washington, DC, eventually serving as Canon for Evangelism in the Episcopal Diocese of Washington. Currently, Tricia serves as a non-stipendiary priest at the Church of Saint Clement in Alexandria, VA.

Tricia is a member of the Presiding Bishop's Strategic Cabinet on Evangelism and one of the original writers of the "Way of Love." Tricia is an honors graduate from Harvard College, the Harvard Divinity School, and received her doctorate from the Virginia Theological Seminary. She is the author of four books on faith formation, *The Soul of Adolescence*, *Teaching Faith with Harry Potter*, *What is Evangelism?* and her most recent, *The Evangelist's Breviary*.


DAVID JACKSON SCRIPTURE PATRICIA JACKSON PRAYER



David's Ocean Park roots spring from his great-grandfather Rev. Charles William Turner, who brought his Baptist congregations to Ocean Park and served as pastor for the Maine Seacoast Mission. David and Patricia share a love and support of family and are ecstatic to be new grandparents of a 6th generation Ocean Park Jackson!

Mission Statement: The purpose of the Ocean Park Association is to affirm the traditions and spiritual heritage of which we are heirs, through a summer assembly program where Christian worship, principles and ideals are at the focus; where diversity is celebrated and the dignity of all is embraced and respected; where the natural beauty of our seaside resort is conserved and enhanced; and where programs centered on religion, education, recreation and culture provide opportunities for individual growth and family enrichment.

<u>Temple History</u>: The Temple was built by Free Will Baptists during a six-week period in the summer of 1881; it was dedicated on August 2nd of that year, which was also the first day of the Assembly Program in Ocean Park. The octagonal structure represents an architectural style popular at the time. It seats up to 750 people, and is the site of most cultural events.

The Temple is open weekday mornings for meditation and observation.
