

Sermon

"Those who cannot increase you will inevitably decrease you," Epictetus aptly stated centuries ago. As a life giving spirit, Michael Wayne Walker nurtures the conditions for people to increase. Through offering vision, hope and analysis, his work demonstrates a critical posture that challenges people toward personal and structural transformation.

The wit of Michael Walker builds mutually affirming relationships and greets the child within every person, in fact daily Walker takes time to giggle and affirm the child within himself. His favorite day is Friday, the thirteenth. His favorite poem is "We Are the Young Magicians," by Ruth Forman. His favorite sacred text is Ecclesiastes 10:19.

As an exegete of scripture and society, Walker helps people develop their comic vision and laugh life. Walker was the Administrative Minister of the Messiah Baptist Church of Brockton for 35 years. During this time, he never saw a toy or playful person that he didn't like.

Walker is a financial advisor that helps families implement actionable steps that one can take that will provide a known result and take key retirement risks off the table. With an educational background that starts at St. Mark's School of Texas and culminates at Harvard, Walker's doctorate is in African American Religious Thought.

Determined to assist a low-income community turn nickels into dollars, in the spirit of Maggie Lena Walker, along with the people of Messiah Baptist Church, Michael Wayne Walker started a Credit Union in 1983 that is still one of only two African American owned and operated financial institutions in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to this day.

Along with his wife, Paulette Abney-Walker, Walker says that his mentors are his grandsons, Jonathan Nyrobi Harris, Cruz Michael Harris, and Aiden Keith Harris.

When asked to describe himself he says, "Michael Wayne Walker is ... a fool for the Lord."

Amy received her PhD from the University of California – Los Angeles.





<u>Mission Statement</u>: The purpose of the Ocean Park Association is to affirm the traditions and spiritual heritage of which we are heirs, through a summer assembly program where Christian worship, principles and ideals are at the focus; where diversity is celebrated and the dignity of all is embraced and respected; where the natural beauty of our seaside resort is conserved and enhanced; and where programs centered on religion, education, recreation and culture provide opportunities for individual growth and family enrichment.

<u>Temple History</u>: The Temple was built by Free Will Baptists during a six-week period in the summer of 1881; it was dedicated on August 2nd of that year, which was also the first day of the Assembly Program in Ocean Park. The octagonal structure represents an architectural style popular at the time. It seats up to 750 people, and is the site of most cultural events.

The Temple is open weekday mornings for meditation and observation.
