FROM THE BOARDROOM, By Kathy Wade, OPA Secretary

Welcome to the new Environment & Natural Resources Standing Committee. When the OPA Members adopted the Amended and Restated Bylaws at the Annual Meeting in July, a new Standing Committee was created – the Environment & Natural Resources Committee (ENR, for short). This allowed the Board to appoint a Chair to lead the ENR Committee and to elect members, each to hold their appointments until the next Annual Meeting of Members in July 2024. The Board appointed Justin Foster as the ENR Chair prior to the August Board meeting so that he could participate as a voting member of the Board. Then, at the Board's August meeting, the Board elected the following ENR Committee members to serve until the next Annual Meeting:

<u>Personnel Subcommittee</u>. At its August meeting, the Board agreed to establish a new Personnel Subcommittee for the purpose of supporting the Executive Director in personnel and human resources matters, including review of personnel and compensation policies and practices; review employee retention issues; and being available to receive workplace complaints about employees or volunteers, working with the Executive Director when appropriate, to ensure that they are investigated and addressed. This Subcommittee will be comprised of at least three members, who will be appointed by the President and will report to the Executive Committee.

<u>Property Needs Assessment Ad Hoc Committee</u>. At the recommendation of the Property Committee, the Board authorized the establishment of an ad hoc committee to assess the capital needs of the Association.

Joint Development & Finance Ad Hoc Committee. An ad hoc committee comprised of members from the Development and Administration & Finance Committees was created during the summer to study and suggest improvements to our approach to membership, giving and long-term financial support of the Association. A report to the Board is expected in October, which will include suggestions for energizing this year's annual fund appeal to help close the gap between revenue and expenses and providing a framework for increasing support by members and others in the future.

Board Sets Regular Meeting Schedule for the Year. The Board will meet via Zoom on the last Thursday of each month through June, except for December, beginning at 7:00 pm. In an effort to make Board meetings more efficient and productive, reports and committee minutes will be made available well in advance of the regular meetings for review by the Directors, allowing more time for discussion of time-sensitive and/or strategic matters. Once the "Members Only" section of the OPA website is finalized, upcoming meeting agendas and minutes will be posted.
