News From the Development Committee

Ocean Park Association Year End - We Need Your Support!

The Ocean Park Association sends out a donation appeal twice a year. This year we wanted to share with you some information about why it's <u>crucial</u> for YOU to financially support the OPA with a year-end donation.

Thanks to all of our members and supporters, through some challenging times during the pandemic, we have been able to have stable revenue. **However**, at the same time, our expenses and future expenses have increased significantly. It's not just the cost-of-living increases - we have significant improvements that need to be made to several of our buildings, preservation of our natural resources like Guild Park, and technology improvements.

Despite these challenges, The Ocean Park Association has made great strides in 2023 and are actively planning a robust 2024.

What did we accomplish in 2023?

- We welcomed Lori Gramlich as our new Executive Director.
- We hosted over 250 programs during the 2023 11-week season.
- We hosted a successful spring clean-up day with members.
- We launched a new OPA website.
- A significant amount of our budget goes towards building repairs and maintenance. In 2023 we were able to make significant repairs and improvements to **The Temple** (new curtains and lighting system), **Porter Hall** (safety improvements accessing the storage area), **Tennis Courts** (extensive repairs needed after the December storm), **Library** (electric and roof repairs), upgrades at **Cheney** (kitchen cabinets, ceiling repairs) and window repairs) and an engineer was hired to survey the **Rec Hall** for future improvements.

What do we need to accomplish in 2024?

Enhanced and increased programming, major improvements to our buildings, further initiatives in Guild Park, as well as significant upgrades to our computers, and upgrading our processing systems to make it easier for our members to use online payment options.

We are asking our members to reflect on how important Ocean Park is to YOU and to *prioritize the Ocean Park Association in your holiday giving plans*. This will help us to preserve our programs, our resources, and our buildings and plan an exciting 2024!

BOARD UPDATE ON THE OCEAN PARK VISION,

With the hiring of our new Executive Director this spring, further discussions on strategies for carrying the Vision forward were deferred. We wanted our new Executive Director to have time to get to know the OPA and the community so that we could have her input.



That doesn't mean we didn't continue to make progress on the goals that the Board established in 2022.

In 2021, after surveying members, we held a 2-day Visioning Session with the OPA Board of Directors. In April, The Board adopted the OPA Vision Statement, which can be found on our OPA Webpage: https://oceanpark.org/mission-vision/

Progress on Vision Goals in 2023 include:

- Successful Volunteer Spring Clean-up May 2023
- New and updated Website rolled out in June 2023
- Enhanced social media presence with notices of events, videos and more to our Facebook and Instagram pages
- Revised Bylaws adopted at the July 2023 Annual Meeting.
- Addition of new Environment and Natural Resources of Ocean Park Committee supporting efforts such as Goosefare Brook Restoration Project and addressing the wooly adelgid infestation killing hemlock trees in Guild Park
- Lowering the age of eligibility for membership to 18
- Enhanced engagement with Volunteers
- Development of a Personnel subcommittee and Technology subcommittee.

Our current focus is on financial stability for OPA's future.

- An ad hoc committee met to strategize ways to increase giving and revenue and reported their findings to the OPA Board in October 2023. The Development Committee is actively implementing these recommendations.
- Potential Grants and diversified funding opportunities are being researched and pursued.



The community of Ocean Park is such a special place for so many. We all have a deep love for this beautiful community and the Ocean Park Association is so grateful for the countless volunteers who do so much for our community. This month, as we enter the season of gratitude, and giving, we would like to focus on some of our incredible volunteers, namely Dayle and Steve Moreau.

Dayle and Steve have been coming to Ocean Park since 1971 and are lifetime members of the OPA as are their children and grandchildren. Dayle serves on the OPA Property committee as she and Steve both feel that it is important to care for and maintain the OPA owned properties so that they will be here for many generations to enjoy.

The Moreaus have been volunteering their time during this past Autumn logging in nearly 300 hours, working at Cheney which was built around 1881 and has needed some love and attention. With love, dedication, hard work, grit and lots of elbow grease, Dayle and Steve have repaired doors, fixed locks, refreshed the kitchen with newly painted cabinets and repainted a rusted refrigerator. In the dining room they added a few extra cabinets for storage so that the dishes now have a home.


Steve has worked many hours on non-functioning windows so that they can be opened and will stay open without prop sticks. The shower doors have been leveled, an inner rail installed, has new caulking has been applied, all to prevent leaking down into the kitchen as has happened a number of times in the past. Dresser drawers have been fixed and glued so they will function as they should.

If staying there, you will now have a towel bar for each person in the room to hang their wet towel on after their shower or from the beach.

This is just a short recap of some of the jobs that Dayle and Steve have accomplished! The work they have done is incredible and we are so very grateful for their commitment and yes – elbow grease to our beloved Cheney! Dayle stated: "We were happy to do this for the safety and comfort of the guests at Cheney in 2024 and years to come!"

We would like to also thank Dave & Vicki Keene for their generous donations of furniture, cabinets and many other articles used for repairs and/or additional improvements for this labor of love.
