Particular thanks go out to Terry Gallagher and Linda Lauritano, who spent long hours most days to ensure that everything that needed to be accomplished was done.

GUILD PARK, by Justin Foster, Chair Environment and Natural Resources Committee

Good news for our much loved Guild Park - The Ocean Park Association's (OPA's) Environment and Natural Resources Committee has been awarded a \$7,500 grant by the State of Maine Forest Service to develop and implement a forestry management plan in Guild Park! The OPA will match the grant 50/50. The OPA has already engaged a licensed forester to create an integrated pest management plan for Guild Park with an emphasis on long-term stewardship, wildlife habitat, invasive species control, and water quality protection. Additional



objectives will include the assessment of overall health and safety of the existing trees with recommendations to address short- and long-term issues. These include woolly adelgid, pesticides, beetles, tree removal, and reforestation. Community education will be a priority as we execute the grant – primarily in 2025.

Special congratulations is due to Cindy Oatis for her leadership in the grant application process. Onward in our efforts to protect and conserve Ocean Park's natural resources!

ARTS IN THE PARK: JULY 13-19, 2025, by Heather Fountain


Purchase a Celebration Paver
