

Charlotte spent 31 years as the newsroom artist and graphic journalist for the Concord Monitor. During that time, she also created Civil War-themed maps and paintings for books and conferences. Her painting of Col. Cross and the Fifth New Hampshire at Antietam is in the collection of the New Hampshire Historical Society. Charlotte retired from the newspaper industry in 2016 to become a full-time painter.

She is a member of Plein Air Painters of Maine, New Hampshire Plein Air Artists, Center for the Arts New Hampshire, the Boothbay Region Art Foundation and Art Guild of the Kennebunks. Charlotte exhibits her work throughout New England and on her website Charlotte Thibault.com.

Liane's inspiration comes from the wild beauty of the New England landscape, and she is especially fond of the effects of light reflecting off water and exploring the exciting world of painting sunsets and nocturnes. Plein air painting has been an integral part of her artistic journey and one that she feels extremely passionate about. She divides her time between still life painting, studio landscape painting and painting en plein air.

Liane has been in many international juried shows and has work in private collections nationwide. She has won numerous awards from some of the most prestigious art competitions including, Best Landscape from the National Oil and Acrylic Painters' Society, The Charles Pratt Award of Excellence in Still Life from American Women Artists, and a Staff Award from the 16th Annual Art Renewal Center Salon, which is the largest and most esteemed art competition for representational art in the world. In addition to being honored at Sotheby's in NYC by the Art Renewal Center, Liane, and all of the award winners from the 16th Annual ARC Salon had their winning pieces digitized and included in a time capsule on the Griffin Lunar Lander launched to the moon in February of 2024, where the collection will be kept perpetually.

Sara Gray - I began painting after transitioning from a successful photography business of 25 years. My work has always been influenced by my love of the natural landscape.

Photography has been extremely important in my transition to painting. It taught me to see and how to compose a compelling image. It also taught me the importance of light and the role it plays in a success-

ful image. Painting has allowed me a different level of intimacy with the landscape. By slowing down and spending hours looking at a subject I see details and subtle nuances that went unnoticed when photographing the same landscape. What fascinates me after spending years of recording light with my camera is that I am now the creator of light in my paintings through the use of color and value.

I studied extensively at the Maine College of Art in their Continuing Studies Program painting with Janet Manyan and Diane Dahlke. After discovering Plein Air painting and the challenge and joy of creating outside once again I began taking workshops with Plein Air painters I admire including Tim Horn, Jon Redmond, Bjorn Runquist, Mark Boedges, Lori Putnam and Claudia Rilling.

I currently paint with oils and the landscape of Maine and Vermont continue to offer a constant source of inspiration.



Melanie Barash Levitt graduated from the Rhode Island School of Design in1990. She currently lives in the White Mountains of NH and is the owner of Jackson Art Studio & Gallery. Melanie is an award winning artist who paints in a loose, impressionistic style with a brush or a palette knife in oils. As a plein air art-
